

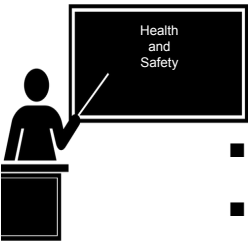


Option 1

(In-Person)

Traditional School

Students enrolled in OCS Traditional School will return to campus and classrooms with in-person teachers and their own personal device provided by the Owen County School District. Health and safety procedures will be enhanced and meet Kentucky's [Healthy at School Guidelines](#) and [CDC's Readiness and Planning Tool for K-12 Schools](#).



Health and Safety

- Symptom screening for all staff and students to include daily temperature checks.
- Students who must be isolated or quarantined will be assigned to OCS Remote Learning.
- Social distancing and masking in common areas with signs and floors marked for safe distance.
- Classroom and teacher assignments may be adjusted to meet [Healthy at School Guidelines](#).
- Limit group gatherings.
- Increase frequency of handwashing and use of hand sanitizing stations throughout school facilities and buses.
- Increase cleaning protocols in all areas of our school facilities and buses.
- Students in K-12th grades will be required to wear masks when appropriate social distancing is not possible. Masks will be provided for those who do not bring their own. For more details, please see the [OCS Face Mask Guidelines](#) document. Anyone who does not feel safe, or comfortable, with the mask guidelines will have the option to select the OCS Remote Learning option.

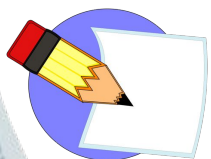


Extracurricular Activities

Option 2 (At Home)

Remote Learning

Students enrolled in OCS Remote Learning will receive instruction off campus with interaction from a teacher virtually using their devices and instructional materials provided by the district. Students will be considered a part of their school and may participate in any services or activities that are provided.

The level of expectation and accountability for OCS Remote Learning will resemble that of the traditional classroom. Our goal is to provide equitable educational opportunities to students at home and in school.



Expectations for OCS Remote Learning

- High-quality Internet access (if you were able to stream videos and Google Meets consistently during NTI in the spring, then your Internet should work for remote learning).
- Students will be enrolled in OCS Remote Learning for an entire quarter (9 weeks).
- Students MUST use district-provided devices during OCS Remote Learning to comply with the [Children's Internet Protection ACT](#) and additional federal guidelines.
- Students and parents will follow the Owen County Schools [1:1 Device Handbook](#) and sign the [Technology Device Agreement](#).
- Evidence of daily participation through assignments will be required.
- Consistent communication and feedback between teacher, student, and parents.
- Note: Remote learning teachers will be assigned by the school.

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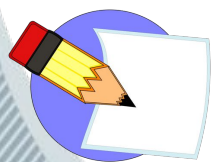

What It Is....

- Students are attending class 4 days a week at school and 1 day at home via remote learning. (Day of the week is yet to be determined.)
- Social distancing will be practiced as much as possible in an effort to meet Healthy at School Guidelines. However, students in K-12th grades will be required to wear masks that adhere to face mask guidelines when appropriate social distancing is not possible. Our schools have the responsibility of meeting the individual needs of ALL students.
- The students' daily schedules will be determined by each school. In addition, changes in schedules may occur in order for us to meet Healthy at School Guidelines. Please refer to each school's plan for more information. This will vary depending on the grade level of your child.
- Technology devices will be used as an instructional tool daily for both Traditional School (in-person) and Remote Learning (at home).
- Parents/guardians will need to plan for the possible cancellation of Traditional School (in-person) due to changes in health conditions and guidelines.



What It Is Not....

- It is not a typical school day due to the need for social distancing and use of face masks to provide students and staff a healthy school environment. Changes will need to be made throughout the semester in order to meet Healthy at School Guidelines.
- It is not an open campus. We welcome our parents and appreciate their support but, at this time, we cannot allow visitors into our schools and facilities to ensure we provide a safe and healthy environment for our students and staff.
- Remote learning days are not days off from school. On remote learning (at-home) days each week, students will be expected to participate and/or complete assigned lessons. Devices and instructional materials will be used to provide learning experiences for students.



Option 2

(At Home)

Remote Learning

Students enrolled in OCS Remote Learning will receive instruction off campus with interaction from a teacher virtually using their devices and instructional materials provided by the district. Students will be considered a part of their school and may participate in any services or activities that are provided.

What It Is....

- Students are off campus every day learning remotely using their district-provided device and instructional materials.
- Students are participating and completing assigned lessons BUT will not have live, real-time interaction with their teachers. Students will have access to teacher feedback and direction during times created by each school during the instructional day.
- It is a learning option that requires high-quality Internet access.
- It is a partnership between students, parents, and teachers that will require consistent communication to be successful. Parents and guardians will need to provide a level of support for their child to access and maintain progress towards their learning goals.
- It provides some flexibility for students and their families but will pose a challenge for those who have difficulty self-directing or may procrastinate.
- A commitment to a 9-week grading period. Students, and their families, need to plan to be committed to this option for this length of time to maintain consistency for both Traditional (in-person) and Remote Learning (at home) students.
- A learning platform that will include pre-recorded lessons, digital activities and assignments, instructional materials, and other resources provided by the classroom teacher.
- A level of responsibility by both the student and parent to ensure the device is used appropriately.

What It Is Not....

- It is not an option that provides a live, real-time interaction with teachers. Students will have access to teacher feedback and direction during times created by each school during the instructional day.
- It is not a traditional 8:00AM-3:00PM, Monday - Friday, school week. Students need to be flexible accessing teachers, lessons, and feedback. Students may have to complete assignments after normal school hours and even on weekends.
- It is not easy. Students, parents, and teachers will need to be flexible and patient as this learning option is implemented and improved.
- It is not access to a device for personal use. It is access to a device to be used for instructional purposes only.
- The Remote Learning option is not days off from school. Remote learners will be expected to participate and/or complete assigned lessons. Devices and instructional materials will be used to provide learning experiences for students.
